NOW COMES the Defendant, [REDACTED] by and through  
counsel, moving this Honorable Court for an order continuing  
his supervised release violation hearing. In support of this  
Motion, the Defendant shows unto the Court the following.

The probation office filed a petition on February 29,  
2000, setting forth the Defendant's alleged violations of his  
supervision. By order received March 3, 2000, the undersigned  
was appointed to represent the Defendant. Shortly thereafter,  
the undersigned together with his investigator, [REDACTED]  
met with the Defendant to discuss his case and to [REDACTED]  
the allegations set forth in the petition.

One of the violations contained in the petition concerns  
the Defendant's alleged unauthorized absences from the [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] Both the Defendant and his probation  
officer provided time-sheet documentation to the undersigned.  
Although counsel has begun to chart the information from the  
various time records, he cannot complete this task without  
interviewing personnel from both the Troy House and the

Defendant's workplace. This counsel cannot accomplish because this Office's investigators are attending the national investigator's conference the entire week of March 20. Also, it is anticipated that the Defendant will have to subpoena witnesses from the [REDACTED] and his job site.

For these reasons, the Defendant requests that the court continue the hearing of this matter for at least two weeks beyond the present hearing date of March 23, 2000.

Counsel has communicated with the attorney for the government about this Motion and she has expressed that the government is ready to proceed but takes no position with regard to this motion. The Defendant's probation officer, Ms. [REDACTED] respectfully requests that the court not reschedule the Defendant's hearing during the week of her annual leave, April 17-24, 2000.

WHEREFORE, based upon the foregoing, Defendant respectfully requests this Court to enter an order resetting the Defendant's hearing to a date not prior to April 7, 2000.
